Message from Rev. Jen

Happy Summer, Emmanuel family!

As we prepare to kick off a new program year on Sunday, September 15th, I could not be more jazzed!

We are beginning Year Two of *Godly Play* as a parish, and I continue to be thrilled by the reception this curriculum has received among the children. Their ability to retain and reflect on the stories in creative ways is awe-inspiring, and I consider myself blessed to be able to learn from, and grow with, the children of EEC. But this program does not run by itself - it requires two volunteers a week. Yes, just two! I am thankful for the committed, faithful volunteers who gave of themselves to story tell and help with the Godly Play program last year; thanks to each of you again for your awesomeness, y'all are amazing. AND I am seeking MORE volunteers this year! NO experience is required. Leading 30 minutes of Godly Play once a semester (twice a year would only be an hour of your time!) is a perfect way to invest in the future of the Church, and the lives of Emmanuel's precious kiddos, and I am asking you to please really consider this opportunity. As my role within worship has increased due to Joani's departure, I am unable to story tell as much as I did last program year, meaning the addition of more volunteers is crucial in order for this ministry to continue to thrive. Strong, active layleadership is a sign of a healthy parish, and something that Emmanuel has in abundance I pray that this participation can extend to the Godly Play program, and that more volunteers might be willing to step out of their comfort zone and give this a go. I am a believer in this program, and a believer that every person at EEC already has everything they need to be a great "Godly Player," and I would love to share that support with you.

CHAOS (Christ, Hope, and Occasional Snacks), EEC's youth ministry, will be engaging in some new and exciting opportunities in the 2024-25 program year, including camping at Pohick Bay Park, assisting with the EEC children's ministry, and several unique fundraisers in support of a mission trip in the summer of 2025! The middle and high schoolers at Emmanuel are a truly special group, and it has been a privilege and a true joy to get to know each of them better over the past year. Seeing them mature and grow into themselves is incredible, and I am really looking forward to kicking off a new year of adventures together!

For the past year, I have also been the clergy liaison to *EEC's Outreach Ministry*, and what a wonderful year it has been! Outreach Ministry is unique in that, while some needs in this world remain the same, there are always new needs and opportunities to serve others that crop up. This ministry ebbs and flows, and is truly a sign of a changing world, and parish. My deepest joy this year has been watching Emmanuel's relationship with ALIVE! deepen. In just the month of August Emmanuel is actively supporting three of ALIVE!'s ministries – their food, furniture, and housewares programs. It is humbling to see an organization like ALIVE! doing so much good in our community, and it is a true blessing for Emmanuel to assist in their work in a variety of ways. I am bursting to share with you all some new outreach opportunities that Emmanuel has the chance to engage in, but all in due time...




Outreach


CHAOS gets a new room!
